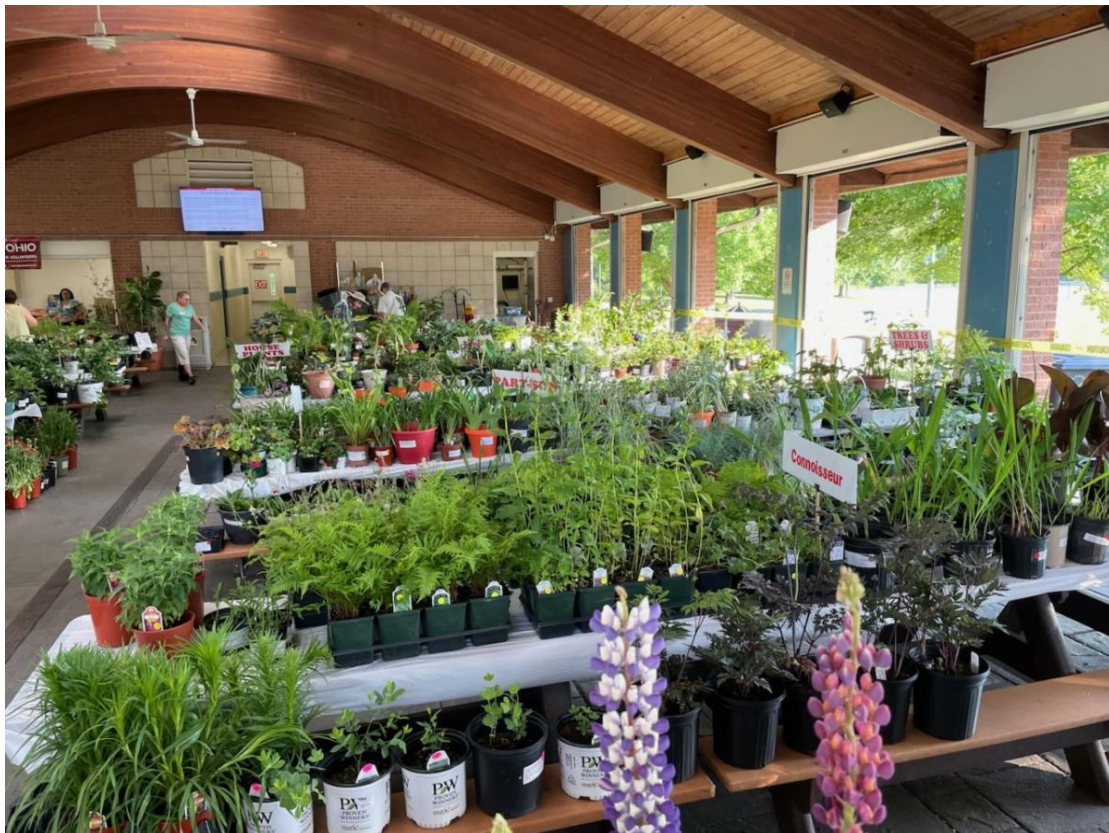
- **Volunteer Opportunity - Seeking MGVs to assist at The Nature Center at Shaker Lakes Plant Sale**

To sign up, just follow the instructions on the page. It only takes a few seconds. As you'll see, this spreadsheet will ask you to sign up for the mornings/afternoons you'd like to volunteer the day before the sale, Friday, May 31st and/or the day of the actual sale, Saturday, June 1st, 2024.

We have also attached two additional pieces of information for you to look over. The first is a brief summary of what each of our Plants in the Park teams is responsible for. The second spreadsheet provides the names and contact information for their respective team leaders. After reading these committee descriptions, if there is a committee you're particularly interested in being a part of, or if you've worked on a PIP committee in the past and would like to do so again this year, please contact the specific team lead directly to be added to their list of committee members. If you don't have a preference of committees, we'll be happy to assign you to a committee where we need additional volunteer support. Finally, if you are only able to volunteer for a part of a shift, please let me know via a phone call, email, or text message.

We would also appreciate it if you could bring any of the equipment and/or supplies we need to support our plant sale (i.e., wagons, carts, hoses, brooms, etc.) If you are able to help us with this, please use this [LINK](#) to indicate what items you'll be able to bring.

PIP Team Descriptions

Cashiers: Calculate total sales for each customer. Accept payments via check, cash, and credit card (Operate credit card application, e.g., 'Square Card'). When: Day of the sale: 9 AM – 1 PM.

Container Planting: Pot up containers with annuals, succulents for sale at PIP. Experience is helpful. Need containers. Volunteers to adopt and care for planters prior to date of sale. When: Saturday, May 18th, 9:30 AM – 1 PM.

Food: This job is about feeding our volunteers. Includes the ordering, transport, set-up and clean-up on Friday and

Saturday. No plastic water bottles, please. When: Friday 7:30 AM – 4 PM, Saturday 7 AM – 1 PM.

Garden Décor/Accessories: Collect, transport, price and sell garden accessories, tools, and supplies. When: Friday 7 AM – 4 PM, Saturday 7 AM – 1 PM.

Greeters: Welcome customers. Ensure they have an overview of the floor and holding area. Be knowledgeable about payment methods. Discourage pets, strollers, wagons from entering the Pavilion. When: Saturday 8 AM – 1 PM.

Holding Area: Segregate and label customer purchases while customers continue shopping. This is a busy spot! When: Saturday 7 AM – 1 PM.

In-take Table/Plant ID: ‘Spa Treatment’ for donated plants---trim unsightly leaves, wipe down pots, etc. Unmarked or questionable plant identification is referred to Plant ID table for resolution. When: Friday 9 AM – 4 PM.

Marketing/Promo: Publicity within MGCV population (News You Can Use/Constant Contact). Flyers posted in local libraries, community centers, etc. Media publicity. When: April and May, 2024.

Pavilion Logistics/Signage: Prepare, set-up, maintenance (during the sale) and clean-up of the Kiwanis Pavilion-- tables for plants, sales areas, cashiers, holding areas at the Pavilion. When: Friday 7:30 AM – 4 PM, Saturday 7 AM – 3 PM.

Plant Acquisition: Work with growers/retailers for plant donations or discounts. Relationship with wholesalers and retailers helpful. When: March 1st through May 31st.

Plant Inventory: Create list of available plants before sale and take final inventory of remaining plants post sale. When: Friday (May 31st) 3-4 PM Saturday 1-2 PM.

Plant Movement/Placement: Direct the flow of prepped and priced plants to the appropriate sales tables.

Plant Pricing: Review plants and establish prices based upon variety, health, and size of plants. When: Friday 9 AM – 4 PM.

Reference Table: Provide Hotline on the Road type support. Need to know how to use reference materials. When: Saturday 8:30 a.m. – 1 p.m.

Sales Floor: Assist customers with layout and procedures. Hand-out boxes if needed, help load up cars, etc. When: Saturday 8:30 AM– 1 PM.

Signage: Place our Plants in the Park signs at major intersections in Independence. Collect signs at the end of the sale. When: Saturday 7:00 AM and at 1 PM.

Transportation: Pick up plants, container gardens, accessories from designated hold areas to the Kiwanis Pavilion. When: Thursday, 3 PM to 7 PM, Friday, 7:30 AM until all plants are delivered to the Pavilion.

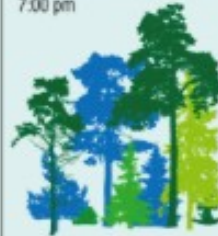

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MGV Coordinator "Important Info" Archive: *Please use this ongoing archive to access important and helpful information shared by myself to assist you in being an effective MGV.*

Need help finding MGCC Projects or Roster? Follow these steps:

- Log into this [LINK](#)
- Scroll down to **MY COUNTIES**
- Click on the grey box titled: **SEARCH PROJECTS** to locate full list of current MGCC projects. Click on the title of the project to access description.
- Click on the grey box titled: **ROSTER** (located to the right of the **SEARCH PROJECTS** box) to locate the names, status, phone, and email addresses of your fellow MGVs.

HANDS ON CONNECT TIPS:

- Accessing Hands on Connect: - **BOOKMARK** the following link: <https://mgvolunteers.osu.edu/> - doing so will provide easy access to the site and you won't have to reach out to me. :)
- **REMEMBER** to log-in - the log-in button is in the upper right corner - otherwise, the information you see does not directly pertain to you.
- The Roster is located under the heading - **MY COUNTIES**. The Roster is in the third grey box to the right.
- If/when you are interested in a project you **need to reach out directly** to the chair in charge of that project to sign up. For instance, if you wanted to work with the Community Garden Mentors, you would reach out to Emily Roll. Contact information for every Master Gardener Volunteer is located under the **ROSTER** in Hands on Connect.
- **Do NOT** use the Hands on Connect sign-up feature – it is more a function of the system than a sign-up tool. Expressing interest basically pins the project to your page and allows you to then log any volunteer time spent or CE's earned.

- Take the time to familiarize yourself with the site - you can't break it and it will be much easier to use once you've clicked on a few links. You can't get the lay of the land, so to speak, until you explore.

2024 Hour Requirements: 25 Volunteer Hours / 10 Continuing Education Hours - due October 31, 2024.

Your volunteer and continuing education hours should be earned participating in county and OSU Extension sponsored activities and continuing education opportunities. The goal is to support our county's projects benefiting the public and to gain OSU Extension-approved, science-based knowledge.

DON'T DELAY - start earning hours as soon as you can in 2024! It's always easier to accrue hours when our programming is in partial to full swing than to wait until our programming has wound down and hours are due to try and scramble to find hours to fulfill your requirements.

BUSY CAREER or HOME LIFE & WANT TO REMAIN AN MGV? - for those of you working full time, we know work gets crazy, so consider opportunities you can do at home to maintain your status as an MGV:

- Volunteer at Ben Franklin Perennial & Herb Demo Gardens Saturday offerings - stay tuned for dates!
- Participate in Telephone Hotline (task completed from the comfort of your own home).
- Join the Ask a Master Gardener team (questions answered online - also done from the comfort of your own home).
- Become a member of the Tech Team (also from the comfort of your home).
- Assist community gardens by becoming a Community Garden Mentor - mostly you respond to phone calls.
- Be a regular contributor to the MGCC Facebook page.
